## **200th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION**

We are excited to announce that 2022 marks the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. John UCC in Bolivar. To celebrate this milestone, we have planned several events throughout the spring and summer. Our first and second events took place on May 15<sup>th</sup> and June 19<sup>th</sup>. We were pleased to have several familiar faces in the congregation. Our final event will be held on August 14<sup>th</sup>. Details for the event can be found later in the Epistle.

### **A Short History of St. John UCC of Bolivar**

*Around 1819, there was a small community of settlers a short distance south of the present Bolivar. This Zutavern Community, by 1822, had a “Society of German and English Lutherans”. The Church Society met in homes until 1833 when a log church was built 2.5 miles southwest of Bolivar on the present County Road 422. Many people traveled from the new town of Bolivar to the Zutavern Church for services. In 1853, a group of members from the Bolivar vicinity left the Zutavern Church and organized an independent congregation known as the German Evangelical Lutheran Church of St. John in Bolivar which was formally incorporated in 1856. When St. John Church joined the German Evangelical Synod of North America, it changed its name to St. John Evangelical Church, the name still visible in large letters in the window over the entrance to the present building.*

*With the merger of the Evangelical Synod and the Reformed Church in the U.S. in 1934, St. John changed its name to St. John Evangelical and Reformed Church. Another merger came in 1957 with the Congregational Christian Churches and St. John became known as St. John United Church of Christ.*

*The original church was built in 1871. Later, two Sunday school rooms and a new entrance were added and in 1925, a basement was dug under the church by hand. In 1951, wings were added to the sanctuary and the basement was remodeled. The education wing, offices, additional bathrooms and a vestibule were added in 1968-1971. Extensive remodeling of the sanctuary and the basement fellowship hall and kitchen were completed in 1986.*

Dear members and friends,

On August 14, during worship we will have an opportunity to share with one another memories of the past of time spent at St. John UCC. I even choose to share this information with anyone who's willing to listen. Every year I buy several calendars to share with others. Inevitably, the next year folks are looking for another calendar because it simply works. Ask me and I'll tell you about it.

Just as the Farmer's almanac works, I believe that God is very real and active in our lives today. I also share this good news with anyone who is willing to listen. I also pray with anyone who requests help. I don't pray because it's what Christians do, but I pray because in my life I have repeatedly seen what difference prayer makes. I feel truly blessed to be able to lead worship in two different churches on Sunday mornings. People really are listening, learning, and growing in their faith. I fear though that many people no longer believe in God's power, just like people don't believe in the almanac. All I can say to everyone who is reading this is, it really works. If people just take the time to draw near to God in worship with other believers, miraculous things can and do happen.
