December 1 marks the first Sunday of Advent. On that day we begin a new liturgical year, Year A in the Revised Common Lectionary. We move from the Gospel scriptures recorded by Luke to those recorded by Matthew. Interestingly, those scriptures appointed for this Sunday concern events toward the end of Jesus's life, not the beginning. Matthew's birth narrative occurs on the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and the visit to the young Jesus by the wise men is not included at all.

Instead, we are led from the birth directly to the "Escape to Egypt," and it is there that I want to focus our thoughts. "Now after they [the wise men] had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.' Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, 'Out of Egypt I have called my son.' When Herod saw that he had been tricked by the wise men, he was infuriated, and he sent and killed all the children in and around Bethlehem who were two years old or under, according to the time that he had learned from the wise men." Matthew 2: 13-16

A couple with their young child flees from an oppressive society and perhaps even death, at least for their son. They are "aliens" yet they are welcomed. They have little or no money, yet they are accepted. They are not turned away. They are not imprisoned. Their son is not separated from them and locked in a cage. Instead they are allowed to live together in this foreign country until Herod has died, and it is safe for them to return to their home.

As we approach this Christmas season, let our prayers be with the many families who have not received this kind of welcome in our country.
