We were open twice in October and once in November. Our helpers included Becky M. and Becky W., Chris, Jean, Cathy, Lynn, Birdie, and Jane Hough. On October 24, after closing the Closet we all went to the Towpath for lunch. Once or twice a year we reward ourselves with a social gathering, although the Clothes Closet itself is often a social gathering. We served hot cider and powdered doughnuts to our guests at the end of October. In October, we had nine customers and a little over \$25 in receipts. In November, we had seven customers and took in a little over \$33 dollars.

## **AMAZON SMILE**

It was suggested by a member of the congregation to start an Amazon Smile account. Below is more information on this program. If you have any additional questions, please call the church office.

### **What is the AmazonSmile Foundation?**

The AmazonSmile Foundation is a 501(c)(3) private foundation created by Amazon to administer the AmazonSmile program. All donation amounts generated by the AmazonSmile program are remitted to the AmazonSmile Foundation. In turn, the AmazonSmile Foundation donates those amounts to the charitable organizations selected by our customers. Amazon pays all expenses of the AmazonSmile Foundation; they are not deducted from the donation amounts generated by purchases on AmazonSmile.

### **How does AmazonSmile work?**

When first visiting AmazonSmile, customers are prompted to select a charitable organization from over one million eligible organizations. In order to browse or shop at AmazonSmile, customers must first select a charitable organization. For eligible purchases at AmazonSmile, the AmazonSmile Foundation will donate 0.5% of the purchase price to the customer's selected charitable organization.

### **How does my organization receive the donations?**

Each quarter, the AmazonSmile Foundation makes donations to eligible charitable organizations by electronic funds transfer. Donations will be transferred approximately 45 days after the end of each calendar quarter. To account for Product returns, a portion of the quarterly donations will be withheld until the next donation cycle, subject to any reduction due to returns from prior quarters.
